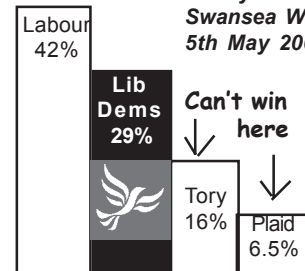

City On The Move

Under the Liberal Democrat led administration work has begun on reshaping our City Centre. Demolition has started on the David Evans store to make way for a new complex. It will consist of 58,000 square feet of retail space in six units across three stores in a high street format. Improvements will also be made to Princess Way as part of the plan. JT Morgan is one of three tenants to have already signed up to the initiative at the former David Evans site along with Zara and Slater Menswear.

The demolition process has now started at the building and is expected to last between 16 and 20 weeks. **Swansea West Assembly Candidate Councillor Peter May** welcomes the news: "After years of stagnation and artists impressions under Labour, this administration is actually delivering. This development will help the process of putting the heart back into our city centre."

Twelve Swansea schools are to benefit from emergency funding to bring them up to an acceptable state. Amongst schools to benefit from much needed work are **Dylan Thomas School** - for mechanical and heating system improvements. Lib Dem Assembly Candidate for Swansea West **Councillor Peter May** says: "This work is long overdue. To have schools shut due to an unfit state is completely unacceptable. This Lib Dem led administration is continually picking up the pieces of years of Labour neglect. Labour Delay Neurosurgery Decision Until After Election
